



**Timothy J. Babineau, MD, MBA, FACS** has served as president and chief executive officer of Lifespan since 2012, Rhode Island's largest health care system. The \$2.8 billion nonprofit organization is the state's largest employer with more than 16,000 employees. Formed in 1994, Lifespan includes three teaching hospitals of The Warren Alpert Medical School of Brown University: Rhode Island Hospital and its Hasbro Children's Hospital; The Miriam Hospital; and Emma Pendleton Bradley Hospital, the nation's first psychiatric hospital for children. Lifespan also includes Newport Hospital, a community hospital, and Gateway Healthcare, the state's largest provider of community behavioral health care. Lifespan recently completed the acquisition of Coastal Medical, the state's largest physician owned primary care group. Prior to serving at Lifespan's CEO, Dr. Babineau served as the President of Rhode Island Hospital, Hasbro Children's Hospital, and the Miriam Hospital from 2008-2012.

Dr. Babineau is a board-certified general surgeon and a professor of surgery at The Warren Alpert Medical School of Brown University. He received his bachelor's degree from the College of the Holy Cross where he graduated as Valedictorian and received his medical degree from the University of Massachusetts. He also received a master's degree in business administration from Boston University in 2000 where he graduated at the top of his class. Dr. Babineau completed his internship and residency at Harvard's New England Deaconess Hospital as well as a fellowship in surgical nutrition and metabolism. He has served as the Chief of Gastrointestinal Surgery and Residency Program Director at Boston Medical Center and Boston University. Subsequently, he served as Senior Vice President and Chief Medical Officer at the University of Maryland Medical Center. He served as professor of surgery at the University of Maryland (2005-2008), associate professor of surgery, Boston University School of Medicine (1999-2005), and assistant professor of surgery at Harvard Medical School (1986-1999). He has been Professor of Surgery at the Warren Alpert Medical School of Brown University since 2008.

Dr. Babineau is the recipient of numerous professional awards and honors, including most recently the Corporate Citizen Award from *Providence Business News*, Senator Chaffee distinguished Citizen award, a Lifetime Achievement Award from the New England Arthritis Foundation, and induction into the Hall of Fame of St. Bernard's High School. He has repeatedly been listed as one of America's Top Surgeons by the Consumers' Research Council of America,

and a Top Doctor in America by Boston Consumers' Checkbook and is a five-time recipient of Becker's 105 Physician Leaders to Know. He is a prolific author of book chapters and abstracts, with more than a hundred to his name. Dr. Babineau was recognized in October of 2021 by the Wall Street Journal as one of the world's most influential leaders.

He currently serves on several boards of directors including the Rhode Island Quality Institute, the Rhode Island Public Expenditure Council, Vizient (the largest member owned healthcare company in the world), the Council of Teaching Hospitals, and the New England Medical Innovation Center (NEMIC). He has served on the advisory board of several medical startup companies. Dr. Babineau lives in Barrington, Rhode Island with his wife and 2 daughters.
